### COG signs MOU with NEA




New agreement focuses on R&D, nuclear technologies

### SMR requirements in focus

#### **Achieving Harmonization**

Harmonization requires collaboration

- Between regulators, and also between industry players; vendors, supply chain, operators
- 2. Examples include:
  - Work performed in the past on Multinational Design Evaluation Project (MDEP), and current work between COG-WNA
  - CANDU 6 fleet in five countries CNSC engagement
- Can be an enabler for an international fleet. Risks to consider:
  - . Taking the most limiting requirements from each country
  - · Introducing delays or changes to the process mid-stream

# COG signs on to industry diversity commitment


In July, COG joined many of its members and partners by signing on to the Equal by 30 global initiative on gender parity, an aspirational goal it has already achieved a decade early.
